

### Sabbath Observance in Hebrews 4 and 10

Examining Heb 3:7-19 reveals the passage is a

Scholars often like to understand the "rest" in Heb 4 as an endtime state or event around the throne of God. However, the time frame in **Hebrews 3-4** will happen before the second coming of Christ, as shown by the two following verses in Heb 3:14 "if we hold secure until the end" and Heb 4:13, "the one to whom we must render an account." In other words, the audience of Hebrews lives in the last days but before the final day.

Using a Jewish rabbinic technique called gezara shawa, the author of Hebrews connects the term "rest" in Heb 4:3-4 to the "rest" on the seventh day of creation Gen 2:2. "Rest" has to be understood in this context, not by importing all kinds of preconceived notions of rest that are foreign to Heb 4. The faithful audience of Hebrews is entering (present tense) the "rest" today. What is the rest? As we already saw, rest in the Septuagint can mean Canaan, temple, or the Sabbath. Canaan is no longer relevant (see, by way of comparison Heb 11:15), nor is the temple (see, Heb 9:24). What is left is the Sabbath.

#### Forward and Back

What a dynamic December! We held our annual Christmas party on December 5<sup>th</sup>. Then, on December 11<sup>th</sup>, we experienced the 27<sup>th</sup> STR Variety Hour at Gladwin Church. It was a heartwarming program with

incredible talent, message, and listener testimonies, all to the glory of God.

We ended the year with powerful "Strong Tower Radio Today" programs. Bethany and David Bolduc (STR co-founders) told their moving backstory of this ministry, "Blueprint for Men" men's ministry, Christmas "Good Growing with the Garden Guy," and finally, the "2021 Year In Review" summarized how much God blessed us this year. The finale of "The STR 48-hours of Christmas" and "The Christmas Hour" weekday mornings and evenings completed the Christmas season.

In June, Pastor Dan Rachor held a seminar on Hebrews 1-3 and 5-8 during camp meeting; later in August, we invited Dr. Erhard Gallos to record a 4-part series on Hebrews 4 and 10. So, in November, we decided Hebrews was our January theme; little did we know that five years ago, the Adult Sabbath School committee also chose Hebrews for the first quarter Bible study. All this is God's perfect timing!

Strong Tower Radio is growing. We applied for ten new frequencies (stations) during the FCC Noncommercial Educational (NCE) window. The FCC notified us that five of the frequencies applied for are uncontested; as God provides, we will add five new stations in the next three years. Finally, we are working out the final details on a station on the west coast of Michigan. We are planning a radio rally to raise funds at the Grand Haven Seventhday Adventist church on January 22nd at 4:30 p.m.

**Sabbath Observance in Hebrews 4 & 10** (Continued from page 1) This is made clear by changing the term *Katapausis* (rest) to *Sabbatismos* (Sabbath observance in **Heb 4:9**) in Greek.

In **Heb 4:10** NAS, the author describes how the "rest" will be possible: "For the one who has entered His rest has Himself also rested (past tense) from his works, as God did from His". This is not a future event/state nor is it a spiritual rest. This becomes evident by the comparative conjunction "as" God rested from His works **verse 10**. God rested on the seventh day, so are we to rest on the seventh day. He rested from all His works, so are we to rest from all our works. Thus, "rest" in **Heb 4** should be taken as a literal seventh-day Sabbath observance rather than a "rest" around the throne of God or spiritual bliss.

Heb 10:19-25 is parallel in its internal structure and phraseology to 4:11-16. The warning not to "forsake" the gatherings (Heb 10:25) connotes not simply neglect but wrongful abandonment (see Matt 27:46; 2 Tim 4:10, 16; 2 Cor 4:9; Heb 13:5). The object of this abandonment is "the assembly/gatherings," a term the author uses to express the assembly of his addressees as a worshiping community. Eusebius uses this term to talk about Christian gatherings for prayer (Eusebius Hist. Eccl., 8.5.1.). The "willful sin" mentioned in Heb 10:26 is language derived from Num 15:25-31. The context describes the distinction between willful/intentional and accidental sins. For the willful sin, Numbers describes a person who picks up sticks on the Sabbath. The present tense of the participle "sinning" suggests that the sin involved is not a single act but a continuing action of neglecting the Sabbath gatherings willfully.

In conclusion, **Heb 3:7-19** is a commentary of **Ps 95**, which has a background of the Kadesh-Barnea experience in **Num. 13-14** (Moses sending out the 12 spies to surveil the land of Canaan). By looking at the term "rest" in the Greek Old Testament (Septuagint), we concluded that this term could refer to the promised land, the sanctuary, or the Sabbath.

The fact that in **Heb 4:10**, the author changes from the word *Katapausis* (rest) to *Sabbatismos* (Sabbath observance) further clarifies what the author intended the "people of God" to enter (**Heb 4:9**). It was a Sabbath observance. This *Sabbatismos* is not for the Jews or the Gentiles but the "people of God."

How are we supposed to enter that Sabbath observance? The very next verse (**Heb 4:10**) explains it indisputably; we are to rest <u>just as</u> God rested from all His works after the six-day creation on the seventh-day Sabbath. God's Sabbath rest after creating this world (**Gen. 2:2**) is quoted in **Heb. 4:4** ("And God rested on the seventh day from all His works" NRSV).

The parallel passage in **Heb 10:25-26** tells us that the acute problem is the intentional neglect of the church gatherings that, as we have seen, are very likely Sabbath gatherings. This continuing, willful, deliberate neglect equates to trampling underfoot, the Son of God (**Heb 10:26-29**). And for this reason, the author strikes such a severe tone in his elaboration on this matter.
